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The Curriculum

Digital Music

Participants are taught how to create music digitally and learn the equipment and processes required.

Duration: 67 hours

Basic theory of Digital Music (7 Hours)

Participants learn the fundamental aspects of sound theory, how to captured sound and the fundamental concepts around digital audio.

Music Creation: Digital Audio Workstation (DAW) software using Garageband (18 Hours)

Through a combination of demonstration, explanation and hands-on practical exercises, participants will learn the various workflows used in contemporary music production today.

Advanced Music Creation: Pro Tools (42 hours)

Participants will be introduced to Pro Tools, an industry standard, professional DAW used for music audio production.

Assessment Methods

Multiple choice exams and various practical projects make up the assessment of this course.

Electives

1: Music Theory (36hrs)

To develop an understanding and knowledge of music theory up to ABRSM Grade One.

2: Instrument Training (36hrs)

Developing an instrument skill is an important part of music. Participants will be taught to play simple songs as a prerequisite for the Performance module.

3: Performance (12hrs)

Through practical sessions, students rehearse and learn to prepare for a performances, whether as an individual, a group, or accompanying other artistes. The instruments have been chosen based on what is offered by the School.

4: Support Services (12hrs)

This module develops a number of skills associated with the activities that support music performances and instrument care. These skills provide participants with career opportunities within the industry beyond being an artiste.
